## \$6,000 Phi Theta Kappa Scholarship

Renewable for Two Additional Semesters

Colorado State University is pleased to announce a new scholarship for non-resident students transferring to Colorado State. The award is \$6,000 per year. It is renewable for two additional semesters, provided eligibility criteria is met, for a total award of \$12,000.

A limited number of scholarships are available. To be considered for the scholarship, transfer students must meet the following criteria:

- Be a member of Phi Theta Kappa
- Apply to Colorado State as a transfer student
- Be admitted by June 1 for fall semester
- Have 3.0 cumulative GPA or higher
- Be classified as a non-resident for tuition purposes at the time of admission
- Be a U.S. citizen or Permanent Resident
