

## “C.D.L. Expectations”

To administer the CDL program, EWC partners with the McMurray Training Center and uses the Wyoming Contractors Association (WCA) to instruct the 150 hour, three week course. This CDL course prepares the student to take the required state CDL test. On and off highway terrains are utilized as well as late model tractors and loaded trailers, tankers, and high center point of gravity loads may be used in training. Simulation may also be used to replicate dangerous, expensive, or hard-to duplicate scenarios. Upon completion of this course, students will take their Wyoming Department of Transportation (DOT) test to be issued their commercial driver’s license. Upon completion of the course, the student will have their CDL certification and DOT physical so they are ready for the many different job opportunities in different industries. McMurray partners with EWC to help students to get in touch with over-the-road haulers with immediate job placement.

It takes several components to receive your Commercial Driver’s License and be successful in your career:

The following is our CDL Course Requirements:

Truck Driver Training Requirements for first day:

1. Drivers License
2. CDL-Permit (often referred to as CDP)
3. DOT Medical Examiners Card (DOT Physical)
4. Motor Vehicle Driving History Report
5. CDL Test History (showing scores for multiple choice test taken)

Permit License Endorsements Required:

1. General Knowledge
2. Air Brakes and Tankers
3. Combinations

Course Duration:

- Three weeks
- Monday - Friday (3 weeks total)
- 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.

Drug Testing:

1. Students are drug tested prior to the first day of training.
2. Students taking prescribed medications must have a note signed by their physician that lists all medications being taken.
3. If students are taking medications that impair their judgment or affect their ability to safely operate equipment they must have a work release signed by their physician on the FIRST day of training.
