



Certified Nursing Assistant



The CNA program offered at Eastern Wyoming College is designed to provide concepts and skills of caring for residents in assisted living, Alzheimer's, long term care and hospital facilities under the supervision of licensed nursing personnel. When the course is completed, the student is eligible to take the National Nurse Aide Assessment Program (NNAAP) examination. Once this test is passed students will be certified to function as a CNA in the healthcare field. In many circumstances the CNA certificate may be transferred to other states.

- Short intense classes offered through out the year
- Classes offered at various times and locations
- Courses are designed to prepare students for employment and/or nursing education program
- Hands on courses with instructor's supervision
- Students may be eligible for funding through the Families Becoming Independent (FBI) or Temporary Assistance to Needy Families (TANF) grants
- One-on-one skills instruction
- CNA C.E.U's are available
