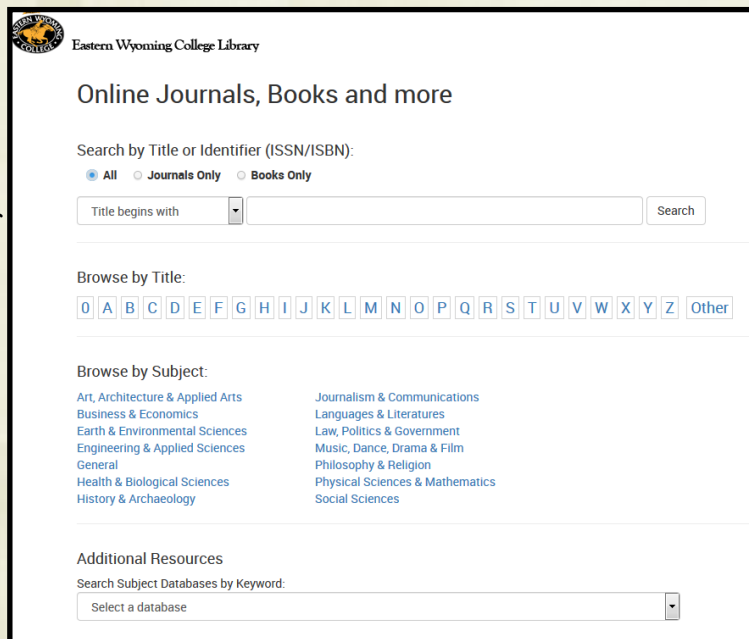

## Journal Lookup

Have you ever found the perfect article for your paper and discover it isn't full text? What now? A quick way to discover if the library has it in another database is to use [Journal Lookup](#).

*What is [Journal Lookup](#)?*  
It is a resource that allows users to search by journal or book title to see where it is available within the library databases.

*Where do I find it?*  
A link to [Journal Lookup](#) can be found on the library webpage in the menu list on the right. Or within every



LibGuide on the Welcome tab under the Summon Search.

*How does it work?*  
Simply type in the journal title, find the journal you are looking for and corresponding publication dates and click on the link. You can then search within that publication title for your article.

It may be an extra step, but it is super easy to check. If the journal isn't listed in [Journal Lookup](#) ask library staff for assistance. They may know a few tricks.
