Commercial Driver License Training Program

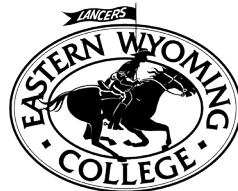


The Eastern Wyoming College Workforce Development CDL Training program is designed to prepare students for entry level driving positions in the commercial trucking industry. The training provides tractor-trailer driving fundamentals to students who have minimal or no truck-driving experience. Upon completion of the course the student will be prepared to successfully complete the State of Wyoming CDL Exam (Vehicle Inspection Test, Basic Vehicle Control Skills Test, On-Road Driving Test).

The non-credit course is a combination of on-line Entry Level Driver Training Theory, Simulator Training, and Behind-the-Wheel (BTW) training including Pre-Trip Inspection, Basic Skills, and Driving Skills. All training results will be uploaded to the FMCSA Training Provider Registry, and EWC will schedule students for their Wyoming CDL Driving Exam.

EWC's CDL Training program is on a rolling schedule with open enrollment with no specific start or end date. For more information concerning the application process, the requirements for acceptance and the fees for the CDL Training Program call Donna White, at 307-532-8213 or stop by the EWC Community Education/Workforce Development Office in the Career & Technical Education Center (CTEC) Room 104.

Scholar-in-Residence in Wyoming Middle East: Crisis of Identity

Prior to becoming a leading Licensed Tour Guide for both tourist and pilgrim groups visiting the Holy Land, Peter served as both a Consultant/Field Officer and Emergency Program Officer for the Consulate General of Italy, primarily involved in the design and implementation of emergency projects and humanitarian aid in the West Bank and Gaza. The purpose of these missions was not only to alleviate the daily hardships of the population, but also to create job opportunities for local economic development; Peter's work focused on issues relating to health food and infrastructure.

Born as a Palestinian Christian in Jerusalem, Peter brings the unique perspective of being both Palestinian and Israeli. He received his Master of Arts Degree in Peace and Development Studies from the University of Gottenberg in Sweden and his Bachelor of Arts

Degree from Bethlehem University, which was the first university established in the West Bank. Fluent in English, French, Hebrew and Italian, in addition to his native Arabic, Peter was also employed as a reporter for Jerusalem Times English Palestinian Newspaper. He is the author of the book Closed for Renovation: On the Road to Emmaus, which has been published in both English and French.

Peter will also be speaking at Western Wyoming College, Central Wyoming College, Northwest College, Sheridan College, Gillette College, Casper College, EWC Torrington Campus, Laramie County Community College, and the University of Wyoming. His speaking tour is funded by a grant from the Foundation for the Episcopal Church in Wyoming.

Intermediate Handgun Proficiency

This class will build on the skills learned in the Basic Handgun/Concealed Carry Course. The goal of the class is to move beyond basic proficiency and marksmanship to learn how to effectively fight with a handgun for defensive

purposes. Students will be taught to effectively draw from their holsters and engage targets quickly, reload quickly, fix common malfunctions and engage multiple targets. If time allows, students will also be taught to shoot while moving. Although there will not be any running involved, students should be prepared to spend about six hours on their feet at the range and to perform a variety of tasks involving moderate physical exertion.

Prerequisites: Must have completed the EWC Basic Handgun/Concealed Carry Course within the last five years or an NRA Handgun class. Students should spend some time reviewing fundamentals of marksmanship and safety procedures prior to class.

Payment Options

Payment for tuition and fees can be made online through your student account on MyEWC, by check, or by phone using a credit/debit card by calling the EWC Business Office at 307.532.8205. If you are paying by credit/debit card, you may use Visa, MasterCard, or Discover. All tuition and fees must be paid in full at the beginning of each semester and before the student attends classes. All checks should be made payable to Eastern Wyoming College. Payment plans may be available from the EWC Business Office for those students who qualify. Failure to pay tuition and fees, or have an approved payment plan in place before the student attends classes may result in a late payment charge. Refunds

Tuition and Activity & Use/Technology Fees are refunded on a course-by-course basis, and are determined by the length of the course and the first meeting day of the course.

Tuition: For courses which meet the full (16 week) semester, tuition is refunded in full for 8 calendar days beginning with the first day of the class. Thereafter, there is no refund of tuition. For courses which are offered for less than a full (16 week) semester, the tuition refund will be prorated.

Activity & Use/Technology Fees: For courses which meet the full (16 week) semester, activity and use/technology fees are refunded in full for 14 calendar days beginning with the first day of the class. For courses which are offered for less than a full (16 week) semester, the activity & use/technology fees refund will be prorated.

Placement Exams

(Accuplacer): Students who plan to enroll in a lab science, math and/or an English class will need to take the Accuplacer placement exam if they haven't met ACT or prerequisite requirements for the class. 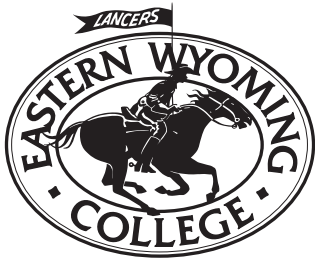

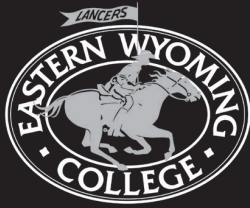

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SOUTHEAST HIGH SCHOOL / TORRINGTON HIGH SCHOOL

Our state believes in its young people and proves it by offering qualified high school students a chance to take college classes for FREE. Concurrent and Dual Enrollment classes are offered through Eastern Wyoming College. These classes count for both high school and college credit. Concurrent Enrollment courses are taught by EWC approved high school teachers at Lingle-Ft. Laramie High School, Niobrara County High School, Southeast High School and Torrington High School. Dual Enrollment courses are college courses taught by EWC and are taught at Lingle-Ft. Laramie High School, Niobrara County High School, Southeast High School and Torrington High School.

- Students get a chance to try out college classes and earn credits toward a two year or four year degree or career/technical certificate.
- If students apply themselves, they could earn a degree or certificate by the time they graduate from high school.
- Students will discover this program is a two-for-one deal: classes count for both high school graduation and college credit.
- Students will be challenged through rigorous college classes while getting a running start at college.
- If a student is a senior, they will avoid "senioritis" by taking relevant classes and starting a college degree or certificate program.
- Students will save money when they go to college because they will not have to stay as long or pay for as many classes. And, the Hathaway Scholarship dollars will stretch further.

Students can enroll in classes at Lingle-Ft. Laramie High School, Niobrara County High School, Southeast High School and Torrington High School if they are eligible and have met course requirements. 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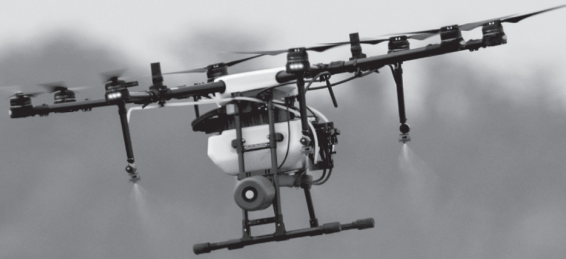

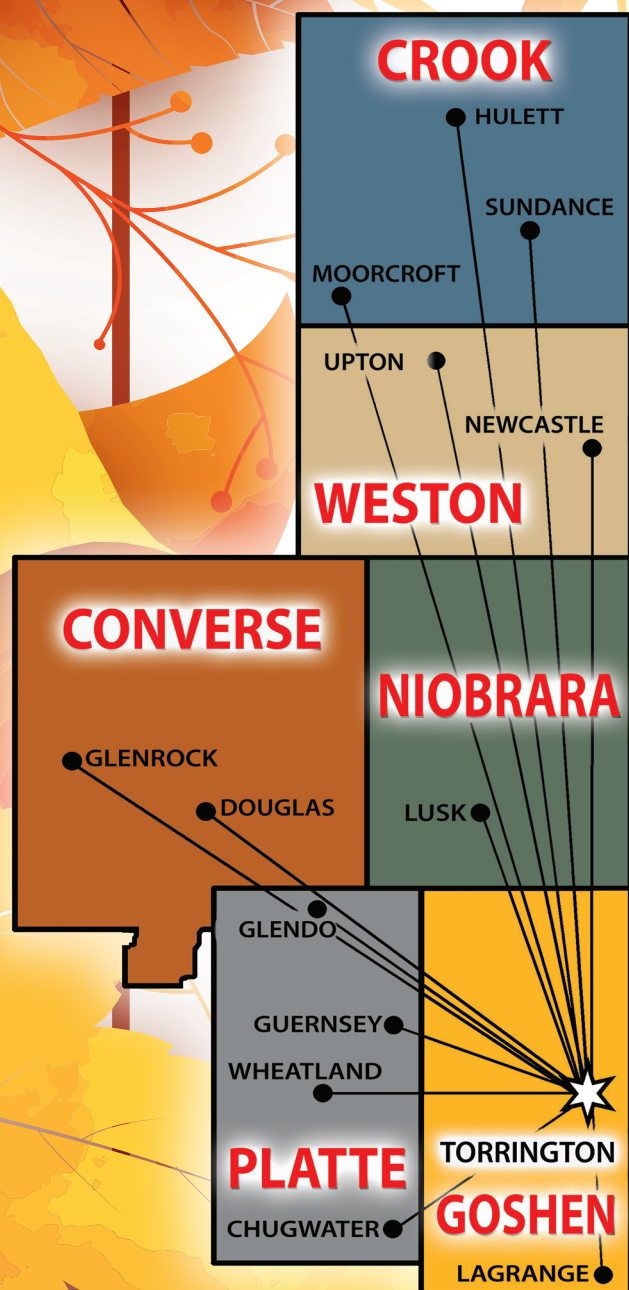
- Students 24 years of age or older
