Program Review Schedule Change for 2022	Due to the cyber attack, several of the program reviews for this year were lost. The following programs that were scheduled for review in 2021 will be added to the scheduled program reviews for 2022 including CAN CNA, Cosmetology, Criminal Justice, and Interdisciplinary Studies.
Course Substitutions for degrees	There has been some concerns about the number of course substitutions that are coming in to the Registrar's office. Reasons why course substitutions are being made include courses not offered following a program curriculum pattern, classes being cancelled, students change programs more frequently (just change their mind or have to change because they can't complete their original program), and advising issues. Roger asked everyone to review their program curriculum patterns to ensure that the course schedules reflect the curriculum patterns and bring any program changes back to CLC for approval.
General Education and Program Requirements double counting for degree	There has been concern on whether general education requirements and program requirements can be double counted for a degree. In the degree audit function of Colleague, a course is either counted as a general education requirement, or a program requirement. Everything else comes in under an elective and Sue has to determine these by hand whether they are program electives or general electives (any course at the 1000 or above level) depending on each program. It was determined years ago when the general education requirements where changed that courses could not be double counted within the general education categories or double counted as a general education requirement and a program requirement. When this was happening, students were coming up short on credits for their programs, and substitutions needed to be made or students had to enroll in an extra semester. Also when courses are substituted, financial aid does not always approve those courses for payment especially if they are not listed in the program.
CLEP and Challenge Exams	There was discussion regarding students taking CLEP or Challenge Exams and who determines whether they can do this or not. Typically, if a CLEP exam is listed in the catalog, the student should be directed to take the CLEP exam. Challenge exams have to be written by the instructor of the course and they may or may not be willing to do this. Since the catalog does not indicate that a student must take the CLEP exam instead of a Challenge exam because the course was listed under

	the CLEP options, the decision is up to the Department Head/Program Director. This needs to be revisited and verbiage needs to be added to the catalog.
General Education Update	Roger will be visiting with Ellen Creagar who will be leading this committee.
Outcomes Assessment Update – Roger	Roger reported that we will be revisiting what we use for assessment (i.e. Perrigrine Perigrine, CCSSE Results, National Benchmark). Right now, we are laying out the framework for Institutional Learning Outcomes (ILOs) which assess the general education requirements and focusing on the Program Learning Outcomes (PLOs).
