

EWC Workforce Development

Commercial Driver License Training Program



The Eastern Wyoming College Workforce Development CDL Training program is designed to prepare students for entry level driving positions in the commercial trucking industry. The training provides tractor-trailer driving fundamentals to students who have minimal or no truck-driving experience. Upon completion of the course the student will be prepared to successfully complete the State of Wyoming CDL Exam (Vehicle Inspection Test, Basic Vehicle Control Skills Test, On-Road Driving Test).

The non-credit course is a combination of on-line Entry Level Driver Training Theory, Simulator Training, and Behind-the-Wheel (BTW) training including Pre-Trip Inspection, Basic Skills, and Driving Skills. All training results will be uploaded to the FMCSA Training Provider Registry, and EWC will schedule students for their Wyoming CDL Driving Exam.

EWC's CDL Training program is on a rolling schedule with open enrollment with no specific start or end date. For more information concerning the application process, the requirements for acceptance and the fees for the CDL Training Program call Donna White, at 307-532-8213 or stop by the EWC Community Education/Workforce Development Office in the Career & Technical Education Center (CTEC) Room 104.

***Applicants need to come in person to get the application form and participate in a brief interview. If possible, call Donna in advance to schedule a time.



REGISTRATION DEADLINE: Unless otherwise noted, registration is ongoing until the class fills or begins. Class sizes are limited and registration is first-come, first-served. Registrations are not complete until payment is received.

CANCELLATIONS: Occasionally classes are cancelled due to insufficient registration or unforeseen circumstances. All fees will be refunded if Eastern Wyoming College cancels the class. Typically, the decision to cancel a class is made two days prior to the start of class, so register early to prevent cancellations.

REFUND POLICY: If you want to cancel your registration, notification is required at least two business days prior to the start of class or the registration deadline, whichever is sooner. Payment Options

Payment for tuition and fees can be made online through your student account on MyEWC, by check, or by phone using a credit/debit card by calling the EWC Business Office at 307.532.8205. If you are paying by credit/debit card, you may use Visa, MasterCard, or Discover. All tuition and fees must be paid in full at the beginning of each semester and before the student attends classes. All checks should be made payable to Eastern Wyoming College. Payment plans may be available from the EWC Business Office for those students who qualify. Failure to pay tuition and fees, or have an approved payment plan in place before the student attends classes may result in a late payment charge. Refunds

Tuition and Activity & Use/Technology Fees are refunded on a course-by-course basis, and are determined by the length of the course and the first meeting day of the course.

Tuition: For courses which meet the full (16 week) semester, tuition is refunded in full for 8 calendar days beginning with the first day of the class. Thereafter, there is no refund of tuition. For courses which are offered for less than a full (16 week) semester, the tuition refund will be prorated.

Activity & Use/Technology Fees: For courses which meet the full (16 week) semester, activity and use/technology fees are refunded in full for 14 calendar days beginning with the first day of the class. For courses which are offered for less than a full (16 week) semester, the activity & use/technology fees refund will be prorated.

Wyoming Works

Wyoming Works is a state grant program with resources targeted at qualified students to advance their skills in areas that lead to secure employment. Space and grant funding is limited. Funding is only guaranteed for one year.

Grant amounts will be up to \$1,680 per student, per semester for 6 semesters.

Wyoming Works Standard Grant: up to \$840 per semester.

Wyoming Works Critical Grant: up to \$1,680 per semester.

A student's grant amount will be limited to their remaining financial need after all other grants and scholarships are considered.

Eligibility

Eligibility Requirements:

- Must complete the FAFSA form, showing financial need
- Must be a U.S. citizen or permanent U.S. resident who meets the definition of an eligible non-citizen under federal financial aid requirements
- Must be a Wyoming resident
- As required, must be registered with the selective service
- Must maintain satisfactory academic progress in the program
- Must be a new program participant starting Fall 2019 or later
- Must be enrolled in an eligible program (listed above)
- Must maintain continuous enrollment in an eligible program
- A student may transfer from one approved program to another while maintaining continuous enrollment at EWC, or transfer to another Wyoming community college and enroll in an approved program at the transfer institution immediately after transfer
- A student may be eligible for this grant for no more than three academic years (six semesters)

Who is NOT eligible for a **Wyoming Works Grant:**

- Cannot be currently receiving or eligible to receive the Hathaway scholarship
- Cannot be currently in default on a federal Title IV education loan
- · Cannot owe a refund under a federal Title IV student financial aid program or a subsequently enacted similar federal student financial aid program, or a student financial aid program administered through the State of Wyoming.

How to Apply

- 1. Complete our college Application for Admission
- 2. Students must complete a FAFSA each year
- 3. Complete the EWC Wyoming Works form, indicating your program of interest

All steps must be complete prior to the start of classes of the term for which you are applying.

About Wyoming Works

The Wyoming Works Program began as Senate File 122 (SF122) in Wyoming's 65th Legislature. After passing both the House and Senate in February 2019, it was signed by Governor Gordon as Senate Enrolled Act 78 (SEA78). The legislation includes a \$5 million appropriation; \$3 million of which will used for individual student grants, and the balance will support program development. Allocation details will be managed by the Wyoming Community College Commission, as these monies will be distributed among all seven Wyoming community colleges.

Annual Wyoming Works grant availability (for approved programs that span more than one year) is subject to the Wyoming Legislature's appropriation process and is contingent on the Commission issuing a grant allocation for approved programs at the college.

Note: Additional programs, which will also qualify for Wyoming Works grants, are under development. Please check back or inquire with Academic Services regarding new programs.

Wyoming believes in its young people and proves it by offering qualified high school students a chance to take college classes for FREE. Concurrent and Dual Enrollment classes are offered through Eastern Wyoming College. These classes count for both high school and college credit. Concurrent Enrollment courses are taught by EWC approved high school teachers at Lingle-Ft. Laramie High School, Niobrara County High School, Southeast High School, Niobrara County High School, Niobrara County High School, Southeast High School and Torrington High School.

- Students get a chance to try out college classes and earn credits toward a two year or four year degree or career/technical certificate.
- If students apply themselves, they could earn a degree or certificate by the time they graduate from high school.
