Updates to the Nursing Program

- Monica discussed updates to the program included a final 100% pass rate for 2023 and the removal of the WSBN cautionary status. We are now back to being fully approved by the WSBN. She provided both aggregated data and disaggregated data on NCLEX pass rates for both 1st time and repeaters.
- Monica further discussed that the final ACEN accreditation was to provide continuing accreditation until 2031.
- Monica discussed student enrollment and demographic data per the WSBN flier. Given there was only 13% males in nursing schools last year, Monica asked the group for any suggestions on how to increase this particular demographic. She further discussed that EWC was ranked in a number 1 seat in the state for having 100% 1st time pass rates.
- Monica provided EWC nursing program data per Mountain Measurements. She discussed how EWC ranks in the state and nationally. It's the first time we have not been in the last spot (8/8) as we are now (1/9). She further discussed the number of questions EWC graduates take to pass the NCLEX, which 79% took the minimum, indicating the majority are passing quickly. She discussed the average total test time in minutes, which is lower than the national average. Lastly, she discussed how many students applied for Wyoming licensure in 2023, which was 14. This indicates that we are most likely keeping the majority of our graduates in Wyoming.

Monica discussed the End of Program Student Learning Outcomes

EOPSLOs

Safety - Provide safe nursing care within the healthcare system.

Clinical Judgment - Incorporate prior knowledge, current research, and clinical experience in decision-making.

Leadership - Demonstrate leadership skills as part of an interprofessional team to promote desired outcomes.

Patient Centeredness - Use effective communication and advocacy to provide individualized care.

Professionalism - Practice within the core values, principles, and standards of the nursing profession.

Health Promotion - Utilize the nursing process and a broad knowledge base to maximize health.

Monica discussed the Systematic Plan of Evaluation Review with May 2024 graduate information.

- Described in detail how this relates data driven change to each of the EOPSLOs and how they are evaluated
- Discussed we will now do a 3-year rotation of deep review:
 - o 2024: Safety and Clinical Judgment
 - o 2025: Leadership and Patient Centeredness
 - o 2026: Professionalism and Health Promotion
- Discussed 2024 areas at or above the national average and areas below the national average. Overall, we have improved significantly in most areas.
