EWC Creating New Makerspace

Eastern Wyoming Community Education/Workforce Development was offered an opportunity by the University of Wyoming to be included in a WIP (Wyoming Innovation Partnership) Grant intended to expand and strengthen statewide makerspaces.

We are happy to report that EWC received grant funds to develop such a Makerspace. As one may imagine, the task list to plan and implement a makerspace is quite long, but manageable. EWC Community Education/Workforce director, Donna White, is pleased to announce that in the near future the EWC Makerspace will be functional.

Naturally, users will need to have some training for using the equipment in the Makerspace, and Community Education will be scheduling those training opportunities and community members may sign up for time in the Makerspace.



Some readers may be asking “What is a makerspace?”

One definition reads, “a place in which people with shared interests, especially in computing or technology, can gather to work on projects while sharing ideas, equipment, and knowledge.” Another says, “a communal public workshop in which makers can work on small personal projects.”

EWC’s Makerspace rooms will house the following

equipment/centers:

- *3D Printer Center—two 3D resin printers, one filament printer, one 3D scanner;
- *Lazer Engraving/CNC Router Center---2 CO2 lazer engravers, one desktop CNC router;
- *General Craft Center---thermal roll laminator, guillotine paper cutter, button making machine, vinyl cutter, 3 hole punch, coil binding machine;
- *Sublimation Printing Center---sublimation printer, transfer heat presses;
- *Cricut Center—Cricut Maker 3, cricut heat presses; Sewing Center---four sewing/quilting machines, one sewing/embroidering machine;
- *Computer lab---eight desktop computers, color printer.

So be watching the EWC website, local news outlets, and the EWC electronic marquees for more information as to when the Makerspace will be accessible.

There's never been a better time to come back to college. If you are 24 years of age or older and wanting to start college or finish the degree you started, you can receive up to \$7,200 to put towards tuition.

Kickstart Wyoming's Tomorrow is a new state-funded scholarship program for adults enrolling at one of Wyoming's eight community colleges, or the University of Wyoming, to pursue a degree or certificate. You can receive up to \$1,800 per semester if enrolled in 12 credit hours or more, for up to four full-time academic terms.

The Wyoming's Tomorrow Scholarship program and its initial endowment fund contribution of \$10M was established by the 2022 Wyoming State Legislature. Currently, the scholarship program endowment fund is only partially funded so the 2023 Legislature set aside \$1.25M to "kickstart" the scholarship program until its endowment fund reaches the required \$50M and the scholarship is fully funded. By kickstarting the scholarship program, scholarship funds are available now, rather than later, to assist those that want to pursue their degree or certificate at a Wyoming college or university.

You are eligible if:

- You've been a Wyoming resident for no less than one (1) year immediately preceding application or not less than a total of three (3) years at any time prior to application;
- You're twenty-four (24) years of age or older when you begin school;
- You've completed and filed a Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) for the academic year for which you are applying for a scholarship and have unmet financial need;
- You agree to register with the Wyoming Department of Workforce Services by completing a new account registration at wyomingatwork.com.

You may not be eligible if:

- You are currently receiving a scholarship under the Hathaway Scholarship program;
- Are not a United States citizen or a permanent resident alien who meets the definition of an eligible noncitizen under federal Title IV requirements, or requirements of a subsequent similar federal enactment;
- Owe a refund under a federal Title IV student financial aid program, or a subsequently enacted similar federal student financial aid program, or a student financial aid program administered through the state;
- Are incarcerated; or
- Previously received a scholarship under this scholarship program of four (4) full-time academic terms or a total of seven thousand two hundred dollars (\$7,200) in scholarships for unmet financial need.

Commercial Driver License Training Program



The Eastern Wyoming College Workforce Development CDL Training program is designed to prepare students for entry level driving positions in the commercial trucking industry. The training provides tractor-trailer driving fundamentals to students who have minimal or no truck-driving experience. Upon completion of the course the student will be prepared to successfully complete the State of Wyoming CDL Exam (Vehicle Inspection Test, Basic Vehicle Control Skills Test, On-Road Driving Test).

The non-credit course is a combination of on-line Entry Level Driver Training Theory, Simulator Training, and Behind-the-Wheel (BTW) Training including Pre-Trip Inspection, Basic Skills, and Driving Skills. All training results will be uploaded to the FMCSA Training Provider Registry, and EWC will schedule students for their Wyoming CDL Driving Exam.

EWC's CDL Training program is on a rolling schedule with open enrollment with no specific start or end date. For more information concerning the application process, the requirements for acceptance and the fees for the CDL Training Program call Donna White, at 307-532-8213 or stop by the EWC Community Education/Workforce Development Office in the Career & Technical Education Center (CTEC) Room 104.

Placement Exams

(Accuplacer): Students who plan to enroll in a lab science, math and/or an English class will need to take the Accuplacer placement exam if they haven't met ACT or prerequisite requirements for the class. Call your Outreach Coordinator to schedule a time to take the exam. The cost to take the exam is \$20. You may pay this fee online at ewc.wy.edu/testing/accuplacer-placement-testing (Or bring a check or money order).

Refunds

Tuition and Activity & Use/Technology Fees are refunded on a course-by-course basis, and are determined by the length of the course and the first meeting day of the course.

Tuition: For courses which meet the full (16 week) semester, tuition is refunded in full for 8 calendar days beginning with the first day of the class. Thereafter, there is no refund of tuition. For courses which are offered for less than a full (16 week) semester, the tuition refund will be prorated.

Activity & Use/Technology Fees: For courses which meet the full (16 week) semester, activity and use/technology fees are refunded in full for 14 calendar days beginning with the first day of the class. For courses which are offered for less than a full (16 week) semester, the activity & use/technology fees refund will be prorated.

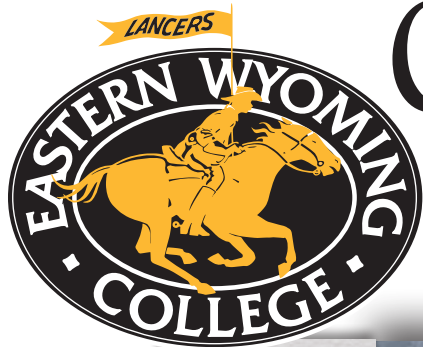
