## EWC Workforce Development

**Commercial Driver License Training Program** 



The Eastern Wyoming College Workforce Development CDL Training program is designed to prepare students for entry level driving positions in the commercial trucking industry. The training provides tractor-trailer driving fundamentals to students who have minimal or no truck-driving experience. Upon completion of the course the student will be prepared to successfully complete State of Wyoming CDL Exam (Vehicle Inspection Test, Basic Vehicle Control Skills Test, On-Road Driving Test).

The non-credit course is a combination of on-line Entry Level Driver Training Theory, Simulator Training, and Behind-the-Wheel (BTW) training including Pre-Trip Inspection, Basic Skills, and Driving Skills. All training results will be uploaded to the FMCSA Training Provider Registry, and EWC will schedule students for their Wyoming CDL Driving Exam which is completed on campus and in the same equipment used for training. In addition to ELDT Commercial Driver License Class A or Class B, we offer training for Passenger/School Bus Endorsement and HazMat (Hazardous Materials) training.

EWC's CDL Training program is on a rolling schedule with open enrollment with no specific start or end date.

### **Become an Official Drone Pilot**

"Because they are operating in the National Airspace System (NAS), the Federal Aviation Administration (FAAA) has taken the approach that any flight by a small unmanned aircraft system (s UAS) is done under FAA Part 107 regulations and requires a FFA Remote Pilot Certificate to legally operate. There is a very restrictive exception for recreational use. Most operators will not fall under this exception. If you use a drone in your business or occupation, you must have a Remote Pilot Certificate" ---Taylor Albrecht

The knowledge gleaned in this class is intended to assist individuals to prepare for the FFA Knowledge Exam for remote pilots. The training is based on the FAA Regulation 14 CFR 107. A prerequisite for this class is having obtained a recreational pilot TRUST certificate and the instructor recommends using trust pilotinstitute.com for this certification as it is free and you cannot fail.

### REMOTE PILOT FLIGHT TRAINING

Now that you've completed the Remote Pilot Ground School, it is time to acquire the flying skills to operate the aircraft system safely and competently. This training is divided into the categories of Basic, and Intermediate . **Basic** will include discussion covering the basics of flying in the National Airspace system and those of safe flight. Topics will include regulations pertinent to flight, flight risk assessment (airspace, weather, PAVE checklist), aircraft familiarization, checklist usage, pre-flight actions, emergency procedures. The flight maneuvers will include takeoff & landing, straight line-away, horizontal rectangular courses, vertical rectangular courses. These

maneuvers will help in the attainment of basic flight skills using the flight controller in Mod 2 operation, **Intermediate** will include a review of the Basic topics and expand maneuvers to include more complex flight: vertical maneuvers, straight line away with climbs & descents, sideways maneuvers, rectangular course maneuvers, S-turn maneuvers, turn s around appoint, semi-circle maneuvers. Students will learn to use both control sticks in concert and provide the skills basis for smooth flight movement required for excellent videography.

## GUT HEALTH & SOURDOUGH BREAD WORKSHOP

Gut Health & Sourdough? What has gut health have to do with sourdough bread? The fermentation process for sourdough can lead to an increased number of prebiotic- and probiotic-like properties, which improve gut health, which means better digestion; better digestion has a positive effect on your general good health. Sheila is going to share information from the extensive research she has done on her personal path of improving her general health and reducing her body's inflammation. And then she will introduce you to the world of sourdough bread by guiding you through the process of making your own batch of sourdough bread that you will take home to bake. She will provide you with the starter or "mother" for the classroom batch and one to take home. You will need to bring the following items to class with you: a quart canning jar

with a ring for your "mother", you will be covering it with a coffee filter so it can "breathe"; a bowl, at least 3 qt, for your batch of bread; a thin, light towel large enough to cover your bowl. All ingredients will be provided.
