Quebec 01 Missile Alert Facility, also known as Quebec-One,

is a former U.S. Air Force ICBM launch control facility located near Cheyenne. Built in 1962, it was initially operated with Minuteman missiles and later repurposed for the Peacekeeper until its closure in 2005. Today it serves as a museum preserving Cold War History and offering insights into its role in nuclear deterrence.

Wyoming Historic Governors' Mansion

served as home to 19 of Wyoming's governors and their families from 1905 to 1976. Rooms have been decorated to represent 1905, 1937, 1955 and the 1960s eras. The Mansion is a symbol of Wyoming History and brings to life architecture and a style that are prevalent in southern Wyoming.

Wyoming Territorial Prison Historical Site

opened as the a U.S Penitentiary in 1872, later becoming Wyoming's first State Penitentiary. The prison ran on the Auburn Prison System. This required silence at all times, black and white striped uniforms and numbers replaced names for some of the most infamous criminals.

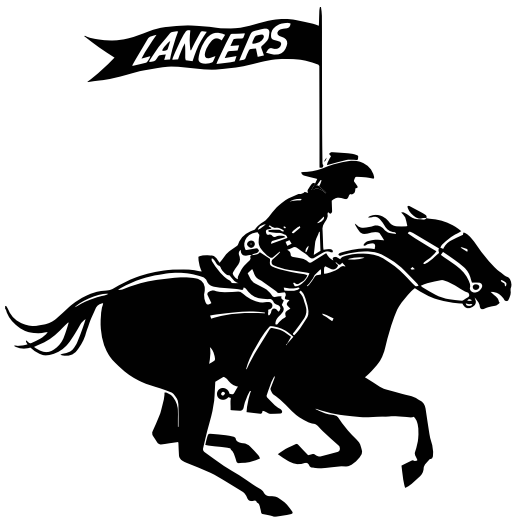
